Proposition 6 eliminates needed road and bridge safety improvement projects

- California has more than 1,600 bridges and overpasses that are structurally deficient and unsafe and 89% of counties have roads that are in 'poor' or 'at-risk' condition.
- According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, there were more than 3,600 fatalities on California roads in 2016. Poor road conditions are a major factor in vehicle collisions and accidents.
- Prop 6 will eliminate funding for more than 6,500 projects currently underway throughout California to upgrade bridges and overpasses to meet earthquake safety standards and to improve the safety of our roads, bridges and transportation system.

- Proposition 6 makes roads and traffic conditions worse, delaying emergency response times.




